According to the National Testing, Agency (NTA), 49 students from Sikar scored over 700 out of 720 marks, nearly ouble of Kota (47 students).

An analysis of the 2024 results shows that of the 50 centres with the highest percentage of candidates scoring above 650, 37 are located in Sikar district. In fact, before the 2000 coach-ing boom, Sikar's population was less than Kota's annual student enrolment of 2.5 lakh, In 1996, Sikar's first coaching centre, Career Line Coaching, opened its doors. While it is

Despite a lower student turnout when compared to Kota – Sikair institutes have around 1 lakh aspirants – the annual fee of Rs 1 lakh is nearly the same. An official says it's not uncommon for institutes in Kota and Sikart o'poach' each other's faculty, Like Kota, the official says. Sikair sinstitutes typically hire III students or teachers as faculty. "In Sikar, even the founders take daily classes," says an institute employee.

A two-year NEET ocurse costs between R 70,000 and Rs 90,000, plus hostel fees.
Justy Joseph, an assistant director at the centre, says they "try to recreate home" for their students. "We understand it is a pres-sure-cooler situation. There is a lot of ex-pectation from parents and peers, besides the expectation students have of them-selves. Our duty is to ensure that they don't feel the pressure but at the same time not lose the competitive edge," he says.
Or as George says. "We don't crack the whip, though the children need to be disci-

plined for their own good."
But the schedule is gruelling, with most students logging in 12-14 hours of study time. "You have to be the best, and for that you have to work really hard. You know you are plunging into a deep sae, you have to swim along, and sacrifice a lot to reach the shore. There are test papers happening almost every other day, and you have to prepare." says Riyan Rasheed, an 18-year-old from Kollam district, who aspires to clear the NEET entrance next year. A year ago, his sister too cracked the NEET exam. On an average, a student sits for 300 tests a year, both online and offline. "So much soit becomes part of your system," says justy.
